### Personal Social Health Education

#### Aim

PSHE teaching should help pupils to learn and gradually master the personal and social skills that are the keystones of a happy, healthy, intellectually stimulating and purposeful life. These skills provide the key elements of social and moral cohesion, stability and positive citizenship.

#### Objectives

- To promote pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development.
- To promote the key strands of British Values.
- To prepare pupils for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of life.
- To give pupils the knowledge, skills and understanding to lead confident, healthy, independent lives and to become informed, active and responsible citizens.

#### Scheme of Work

The school follows the PSHE framework within the scheme for teaching SMSC and British Values and in conjunction with responding to the results of the 'Growing Up in North Yorkshire' survey. In addition, PSHE lessons are used to react to situations that arise from time-to-time within individual classes. These will be recorded in class assemblies and annotated plans.

#### Teaching and Learning

The teaching and learning of PSHE should be in accordance with the school's teaching and learning policy. Due to the nature of the subject, a range of teaching methods are used.

#### Assessment

This is in accordance with the school's Assessment Policy. In the Early Years, the EYFS and Development Matters are used to assess the children's achievements. In KS1 & 2, teachers use the programmes of study and the school tracking system to monitor progress and attainment.
