



Overview of Optional Activities Week beginning 25.1.21 Jungle Animals

This week to support learning you could...

<p>Literacy</p> <p>Watch and listen to Jungle facts Powerpoint. Click on picture</p>  <p>Read stories about the Jungle some stories such; as Monkey Puzzle by Julia Donaldson, Walking Through the Jungle by Julie Lacome and There's a Tiger in the Garden by Lizzy Stewart.</p> <p>Staff will add a story every day to Tapestry.</p> <p>Please can you upload photos of any of your child's work onto Tapestry.</p>	<p>Maths – Capacity Continuing from last week ask your child to explore and compare different quantities of water. This week explore different sized containers and explore the following questions.</p> <p>Which Holds More?</p> <p>Provide a tall narrow container and a wide shallow one. Ask the children to predict which will hold more water? How could they check? Encourage the children to try different methods. More containers could be added and the children asked to order them from smallest capacity to greatest.</p>  <p>Maybe you could order three different sized containers and order from the smallest capacity to the greatest. Take a picture and put on Tapestry.</p> <p>Outside Maths – You can use any small container or pot to hunt for items.</p> <p>Outside</p> <p>Provide a small matchbox for each child. Ask them to hunt for things to put inside. Points could be awarded for specific criteria such as the most items, the prettiest leaf, the smallest pebble, the largest item, the softest item, something yellow etc.</p>	<p>Creative Can you make some binoculars out of some tubes and decorate them? You could use them to see if you can see any animals outside or animal toys in your home?</p> <p>Paper plate parrots-cut a paper plate or circle of card/paper in half and colour it in,</p>  <p>stick it together and add some ribbon or strips of paper for the tail.</p> <p>Hand Drawn Giraffes- draw around your hand and arm and decorate to make a giraffe.</p>
<p>Physical</p> <p>Ball Skills- This week we are going to work on our kicking skills. Using a medium sized ball practice kicking between you and a partner.</p> <p>Yoga- Jungle Yoga https://video.link/w/rFUGb</p>	<p>Understanding the World</p> <p>Where do jungle animals live? Discuss the environment. Is it warm or cold? Watch some of this video clip.
